## LPS Families,

It has been a busy 24 hours since releasing our *LPS Return to Learn* plan. We appreciate your patience, flexibility, and support as we continue the work for the preparation of the start of school. We have received a high volume of questions from families, and we appreciate the opportunity to engage with you. Please know there are many questions yet to be answered as we focus on specific building details, updating evolving policies and procedures, and more. As evidence that this remains a very fluid situation, we have a few updates to provide you with since our message was delivered to you yesterday afternoon. These include:

- Yesterday afternoon, the Clay County Public Health Center announced that Clay County
  will begin requiring face masks and coverings to be worn in all indoor areas of public
  accommodation, effective Sunday, July 19, 2020. This includes schools and daycares
  within the county. LPS will now adhere to this requirement beginning with our summer
  school session on Monday, July 20, and until further notice. More information regarding
  this announcement can be found on the Clay County Public Health Center website.
- The LPS Operating Procedures and Guidelines document has been updated with the new face-covering requirements included. This document can be accessed on our Return to Learn portal, or by clicking here. Please know that this document will continue to be revised as we move through the remainder of the summer and leading up to August 25, 2020.
- Thank you to those who have already completed the *LPS Student Census*. If for some reason you did not receive the census message, an LPS representative will be in touch with you in the coming days to assist you with completing this process. The deadline for completing the student census is **Friday**, **July 24**, **2020**.
- For families with students attending our Early Childhood Center, we would like to direct you to the <u>LPS Return to Learn Elementary Page</u>, as this page also provides information for our PreK students in LPS.

As always, we want to continue to thank you for your patience and flexibility as we navigate through this unprecedented period. We will continue to provide you with regular updates and additional details regarding our LPS Return to Learn plan as they become available.
